NRA Police Pistol Combat Tournament Announcement

The Stockton Police Reserves are conducting NRA Registered Police Pistol Combat Tournaments at the Sacramento County Sheriff Range on the same weekend and simultaneously as a “Postal Tournament” at the Ben Clark Public Safety Training Center.

The Tournaments will be conducted on Saturday May 15th and Sunday May 16th with the Stockton Captain Weber Police Pistol Combat Tournament being fired first. The Stockton Reserves Police Pistol Combat Tournament will then be fired. By having back-to-back Tournaments shooters can compete in two Tournaments in one day or fire in one each day.

Each Tournament will be offering the NRA 60 round Open Class Semi-Automatic Pistol Match 12, 60 round Revolver Match 5, Production Pistol Match 23, Stock Service Semi-Automatic Pistol Match 14, Service Revolver Match 7, Production Pistol Match 23, and Production Duty Optic Pistol Match 25.

Shooters can also sign up to fire the non-sanctioned California Distinguished Revolver, California Distinguished Semi-Automatic Pistol, and California Distinguished Production Pistol Matches.

First Time Shooters

These Tournaments are a great way for you to evaluate your skill level, identify needed training areas, and practice your handgun skills to keep you prepared for the ever-increasing dangers you face on the street and off duty. You do NOT need any fancy gear or guns to start shooting these matches. Just bring your duty handgun, four magazines, holster & magazine pouch. There is nothing to memorize, the course will be announced as you shoot just like the stages during a qualification and fellow officers will gladly help you out. You can even use your stock duty gun to fire the Open Class Division matches to get started and see how challenging and fun these matches are.

Dates: Saturday May 15th and Sunday May 16th, 2021

The Stockton Captain Weber Police Pistol Combat Tournament will be conducted first each day and the Stockton Reserve Police Pistol Combat Tournament will be fired after the first Tournament’s relays have completed.

Governing Rules: Current NRA Police Pistol Combat Rules will govern throughout the Tournament. All competitors are encouraged to review the current PPC rules. The NRA Police Pistol Combat Rule Book is available on-line at ppc.nra.org or use your smart phone camera to scan this Quick Reader Code or Double Clicking on it.



Eligibility: Open to any eligible law enforcement member as outlined in Police Pistol Combat Rule Section 2.4.

➔ **Special Open Class Match Conditions:** The NRA suggested that Tournament Match Directors could, at their discretion, use the 60 round NRA National Police Course of Fire, Matches 5 & 12, for their Open Class Matches at Tournaments to help deal with ammunition shortages.

The CPPA Board of Directors and Match Hosts discussed the matter and came to the conclusion that for 2021 season the Registered Tournaments could be the 60 round Match 5 or 12 for Open Class Matches if that host so desires.

The State Championship and the Regional should remain a full 1500 (150 round course of fire) to maintain the integrity of a Championship or Regional.

Overall, this should result in a much lower rate of ammo consumption for the shooters as well as making their match day shorter.”

The Stockton Captain Weber & Stockton Reserve Tournaments will be shooting the Reduced Round Count Open Class Courses, the 60 round NRA National Police Course.

Registration: Will be done on-site. Please complete the Registration Form at the end of this announcement and bring it with you to speed your registration process.

All competitors MUST present the following items during Registration:

1. Valid Department or Agency Identification
2. Current Classification Card or current Temporary Classification Book unless they have not fired in a PPC Tournament before.

Stockton Reserve Police Pistol Combat Tournament - Sunday May 16th

Conducted each day after the above Tournament is completed.

- Fees are the same as above.

Classification: Competitors will be entered using their current NRA Police Pistol Combat Classification of High Master, Master, Expert, Sharpshooter, Marksman, or Classified. Competitors with expired Classifications and **new shooters** with no Classification or those without a Temporary Record Score Book will fire in the High Master Class as required by PPC Rule 19.2. You can check your current NRA Classification at LEcompetitions.nra.org or by using your smart phone camera to scan the Quick Reader Code to the right or Double Clicking on it.



Categories: There will be no categories used in these Tournaments.

Targets: Official NRA B-27 targets will be used.

Scoring: Competitor scoring will be used. Pursuant to PPC Rule 14.2, **NO** competitor will score their own target **NOR** may a competitor score the targets of a competitor from their same agency. If this cannot be avoided due to the Relay's makeup contact a Match Official to score the targets. PPC Rules prohibit the use of plug-type scoring gauges. Overlays and Eagle Eyes may be used by competitors. Scorecards must be signed and are FINAL once signed so **PLEASE** double check the recorded hits and values BEFORE signing.

Course of Fire Information: Holsters: A conventional right or left-handed exterior belt mounted holster must be used. For safety reasons, shoulder, cross draw, IWB, or holsters which require releasing by insertion of finger within the trigger guard will not be allowed. Holsters cannot be tied down.

Time Limits: Time Limits will be announced for each stage or match with complete course instructions. Time will start with loaded gun in the holster. No part of the competitor's hand may touch the gun until the command to commence firing is given.

Firing Method: Matches or stages designated as double action must be fired double action. Matches or stages designated as single action may be fired either single or double action. All double action semi-automatic pistols must fire the first shot of every stage double action except at the 50 yard line.

Loading: To force reloading under time restraints and magazines are loaded with a maximum of 6 rounds. There is no limit on the number of magazines or speedloaders you have but after initial loading all ammunition used during the firing of a stage or string **MUST** be on your person.

Optical Devices: No optical devices, other than normal glasses worn for corrective eyesight purposes or sunglasses are permitted on the range. This includes the use of a mechanical iris, eye patch, or eye cover. Optical, mirror, telescopic, laser beam, electronically projected dots, computerized sighting-aiming devices etc., are prohibited. Binoculars may be used by team coaches as allowed in Section 12.6.

PRODUCTION PISTOL Rule 3.10	
DISTINGUISHED PRODUCTION PISTOL	
In addition to the specifications within Section 3.1, the following specifications apply for Production Pistols.	
Firearm / Caliber: Approved Pistols for this Division are listed in Police Pistol Combat Bulletin 14.1 on the Law Enforcement Competitions website. To be considered, must be a mass produced center-fire semi-automatic pistol made for police or military use (at least 1,000 pistols), unmodified stock catalog item in its original factory condition, and have a double, double/single, or striker type action. Must be capable of chambering and firing .35 caliber or larger ammunition, or FN 5.7 x 28 caliber ammunition. All double action semi-automatic pistols must fire the first shot of every stage double action.

Trigger Pull Minimum: Single or Double Action	3.5 Pounds
Sight Radius Maximum	7.5 Inches
Installation of extended magazine releases and slide catches produced by the pistol's manufacturer.	Allowed
Replacement of the factory fixed or adjustable service sights with another service type sight, luminescent service sight, or fiber optic service sight sold by the pistol's manufacturer as a factory catalog replacement part for the pistol, or with an approved sight listed in Police Pistol Combat Bulletin 16.1 on the NRA Law Enforcement Competitions website. In no case may the firearm be altered for any sight installation.	Allowed

PRODUCTION DUTY OPTIC PISTOL Rule 3.10.1	
In addition to the specifications within Section 3.1, and 3.10, the following specifications apply for Production Duty Optic Pistols.	
Firearm / Caliber: Pistols meeting the specifications for Production Pistols in Section 3.10 and are listed as Approved in Police Pistol Combat Bulletin 14.1 may be equipped with an Approved non-magnified optic suitable for duty use.	
The Duty Optic must be listed as Approved by NRA Law Enforcement Competitions in Police Pistol Combat Bulletin 19.1 on the Law Enforcement Competitions website.	
To be considered for approval, Duty Optics must mount <u>without any modification</u> to the handgun as originally manufactured. Swapping the original slide to an aftermarket slide with optic mount cuts is <u>not</u> allowed since the handgun is no longer as originally manufactured.	
The pistol should have co-witnessed front and rear sights, but the rear sight may be removed to mount the Duty Optic or to use a stock Optic Ready Plate.	
All Other Specifications are the same as Production Pistols	

The NRA has made it clear that **NO** matter what **APPROVED** Replacement Sight is used, the sights **MUST** keep a Duty Gun Point of Aim/Point of Impact, **NOT** a competition set up, such as a Neck Hold, Shoulder Hold, or Head Hold.

A Duty Gun Point of Aim/Point of Impact sight set up requires the sights to be aligned on the X Ring/Center Mass to obtain a Hit in the X Ring/Center Mass area.

Pistols with competition sight set ups will be **Disqualified**, even if having already been used to fire a Match. Competitors may be required to allow their pistol to be test fired, or checked with a laser boresighter to check the sight set up.
